BEALS HISTORICAL CENTER MEMMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCE

Beals Historical held its annual Memorial Day observance at the Heritage Center in Beals on Monday, May 26 with Selectmen Daniel F. Davis officiating. After a brief welcome and calling those present to remember deceased loved ones and friends, especially those who have served our nation's military in times of war and peace, Davis led the group in a prayer of invocation. This was followed by the recitation of the "Pledge of Allegiance" and the singing of "God Bless the U.S.A. by Debbie Kelley of Beals. A poem entitled, "Memorial Day" by Eula Gladys Lincoln was read in remembrance of those great veterans of years past who gave of themselves that we might live as free people, the setting of which is the "distant field of sunny France...amid the farms of Flanders." This was followed by a moment of silent reflection and a prayer for the memory of each fallen soldier, deceased veteran, or loved one and the playing of "Taps" by

Erin Crowley of Harrington.

Davis then presented a specially prepared address to those gathered, centered upon the origin and true meaning of Memorial Day. He quoted, among others, the admonition of Cleve Geer, National Commander of American Vets (AMVETS), to "...recall the glory and sacrifice of all who have set their personal aspirations aside for the preservation of our society... We owe an enormous amount of gratitude to these men and women for taking up arms against all enemies of the United States, both foreign and domestic." Davis went on to quote Geer as saying, "We spend our holidays gathered with family and friends, ushering in the beginning of summer at picnics and parties, but it is important we remember why we gather on this day. We do this to celebrate those fathers, brothers, sons, mothers, sisters, and daughters, who gave all of their tomorrows so that we could have our todays."

Another poem entitled, "A Memorial Day Tribute", by Michelle Keim, was shared, followed by the reminder, "We owe it to the heroes that died and the loved ones left behind to make sure that their service to this nation always be honored."

Davis then shared the main focus of his address, as follows:

My mind was drawn to just such an event in our America's history as I browsed through a number of newspaper clippings given to me for the historical society. One clipping showed the picture of a young family that has its roots here in the Jonesport-Beals area and the local Beal and Wallace families. When I mentioned this to BHS President, Carol Davis, she told me we had in our Heritage Center Library a new book entitled, *Silent Strength*, by D. Allen Kerr, "Remembering the Men of Genius and Adventure Lost in the World's Worst Submarine Disaster." Of course, he Mr. Kerr was referring to a tragic event that took place fifty-one years ago last month off the shores of New England---the loss of the U.S.S. Submarine Thresher. That event touched the loves of many of us in the Moosabec and Downeast area---perhaps some of you gathered here today.

On April 10, 1963, the U.S.S. Submarine Thresher dived beneath the waters of the Atlantic about 220 miles east of Boston, as it conducted deep-diving exercises, never to rise again to the surface. All aboard---16 officers, 96

enlisted men, and 21 civilians, including Daniel Beal, Jr. originally of Jonesport, died in the tragedy. Dan and his wife, the former Jean Wheeler, an Eastport native and daughter of long-time area barber Harold Wheeler, and their four small children---Daniel Beal, 3rd, Harold, Carol, and Cathy---were living at the time in Somersworth, New Hampshire.

In his book, D. Allen Kerr devotes a section to each of the men lost that day, including Dan Beal, Jr. Davis then read an excerpt from "Silent Strength", a recollection of that fateful morning by Dan Beal's sister-in-law, Patricia Beal.

In April of 2003, Senator John Sununu of New Hampshire, along with Senator Susan B. Collins and several other senators, introduced legislation to honor those lost that 1963 tragedy. Sununu said regarding his efforts for this cause, "This legislation honors their brave service, and the service of all submariners who are "on eternal patrol." The loss of the *Thresher* was an enormous tragedy for the United States submarine service, for the Navy and nation."

Senator Judd Gregg, also of New Hampshire, expressed similar sentiments in a press release, saying, "The brave

sailors and civilians aboard the U.S.S. Thresher made the ultimate sacrifice of our nation. This measure we introduce recognizes the courage and bravery these men demonstrated in risking their lives in the development of the United States Navy's submarine program, a program which has proven invaluable to the American military."

Today, as we make our annual visit to the burial grounds throughout the Moosabec region and see the American flag on each veteran's grave, may we be reminded of the great sacrifice that has been made on our behalf. We think not only of those veterans who served directly and actively in the armed forces of our country and now rest from that service, but of all who have given their lives that the interests of this great nation might move forward as a world power and in service to humanity. We think of those, in particular, who lost their lives in foreign lands and on the seas and their abode is known only to Almighty God.

May God bless our veterans and may God bless America.

The program concluded with an invitation to those present to visit the exhibits displayed in the Heritage Center.
